



They are less aggressive and show more self-control and higher levels of thinking"

Early Literacy & Numeracy









The kindergarten curriculum addresses early literacy skill development through phonological and phonemic awareness. Developing strong oral language skills is a large part of the kindergarten curriculum and foundational to later reading and writing skill development. In kindergarten, both literacy and numeracy outcomes are addressed through a combination of direct teaching and intentionally designed play-based centres.











Enhanced Supports

The classroom teacher is at the centre of your child's learning team and is supported by a school learning team. Based on classroom needs, each kindergarten program will also be supported by a multidisciplinary team that works with large and small groups in the classroom.

This team may consist of:

Education Assistants or Early Childhood Practitioners
Early Learning Strategists
Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs)
Psychologists
Occupational Therapists (OTs)
Physiotherapists (PTs)
School Family Liaison (SFL)

Blue Months- Child must be registered in Grade One.

Green Months- Child should be registered in Kindergarten (*please see below)

Yellow Months- Child is eligible to start Kindergarten in 2024-25 OR 2025-26

Red Months- Cannot register as this child is too young (born after December 31, 2019 cutoff).









Getting Ready for Kindergarten

Build your child's independence by encouraging them to:

- Dress themselves (zippers, buttons, shoes)
- Use the bathroom and wash their hands on their own
- Put away toys and help out in other small ways at home
- Practice opening and closing snack containers and using a water bottle
- Play games, take turns and compromise
- Develop a consistent bedtime routine
- Practice using scissors
- Practice reading and writing their own name



Getting Ready for Kindergarten









Read to your child every day:

- Read stories together in your first language to help your child develop vocabulary, listening and speaking skills
- Enjoy reading different types of books: picture books, information books, nursery rhymes, poetry
- Encourage your child to talk about the pictures and stories as you read together
- Visit your community library (when possible)










Getting Ready for Kindergarten

Take time to talk with your child about everyday activities:

- Share special activities together, such as walks to the park
- Talk about what you are seeing and doing
- Talk, read, sing and play in your first language every day
- Praise children for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks
- Talk about how it is okay to make mistakes





First Days of Kindergarten: What to Bring


When students come to Kindergarten, they need to bring:

- A backpack (make sure it's big enough)
- Indoor running shoes (labelled with their name)
- A change of clothes (shirt, pants, underwear, socks labelled)
- Healthy snacks students need to be able to open packages and containers independently
- A water bottle (labelled with their name)

***It is important all items are labelled with student names.

**The teacher will meet the students outside on the West Side of the School (across from the playground).

Transportation | Bussing


- Students who are outside of the Walk Zone (blue area on the map) are able to access Bussing.
 A more detailed map can be found here
- Registration for bussing is completed online using your MyCBE/PowerSchool Account
- Families must register by approximately June 10 for addresses to be considered for congregated stops (exact date to be determined)
 - Registrations for bussing are accepted after the deadline; however, students are added to the closest existing stop with available space, and processing in September can take up to 8 weeks due to volume
- For Kindergarten students:
 - For a.m. classes, students can take the bus to school and families will need to arrange pickup.
 - For p.m. classes, families will need to arrange drop off, and students can take the bus home
- This year the annual fee was \$130 (one way). It is possible to request to have this fee waived.
- The CBE offers a school bus orientation program for first-time riders and their parents, called

First Days of Kindergarten









The first two days of Kindergarten are staggered entry days. Students come for a shorter amount of time (approximately 60-90 minutes) so they can feel more comfortable and get used to the routines of Kindergarten with fewer students.

Staggered Entry dates are:

- Thursday, August 29th
- Friday, August 30th

Your child's staggered entry times will be confirmed via email, along with your AM/PM designation before the end of June.

Monday, Sept 2nd - NO School for students
Tuesday, September 3 - Regular AM/PM Schedule begins

Volunteering

We welcome volunteers in the classroom, on field trips and with certain tasks at school or at home as certain activities or field trips would not be possible without the active participation of our volunteers.

All adult volunteers require a valid security clearance - **NO exceptions.**

We can start the security clearance process at any time, so that when volunteer opportunities arise, you have a valid security clearance. We recommend starting the process as soon as possible as it can several weeks to complete. Security clearances are good for **five years** and is transferable to any CBE School.
